### Highlights from Octobers speaker, Latham Grimes, developer of the former Westwood Apartments site

Latham Grimes explained the processes his company is going through for the redevelopment of the former apartment site. The fire department is going to burn the buildings for training exercises beginning January/February. After training is complete the site will be redeveloped and new roads added for the new subdivision "Bryant Park". There are some zoning changes which are in the process to "down zone" some of the acreage for single family development. After approval and the site are readied, the lots will be sold to home builders and the community will be constructed. Currently plans call for 190+- single family homes plus a townhouse/condo community. If all goes well, look for construction of the homes to begin in early to mid 2008.

## Meeting Minutes – November 21, 2006

### New Business

- Latham Grimes spoke to the association about his plans for the former Westwood Apartment site. Controlled burns by the fire department will begin this month with final demolition by spring. Site work will begin in the summer and hopefully homes will be built by early 2008. Plans are to build 190+- single family homes plus condominiums and townhouses.
- Canker worm tree banding grant will not be done this year because of time constraints and lack of community participation

### Community Updates

- Community water, sewer, curbing, and sidewalk installation is on schedule. You will continue to see workmen in the community until next fall. Should you have any problems with the construction call Matt Gustis at 704-336-6138
- Only one commercial break-in during October, three search warrants served, and eight arrests on Marlow and Columbus Circle. With the changing of police districts we will gain 11 new officers
- New Bank of America ATM being installed next to the Shell gas station at Westerly Hills Village
- Building of Shops at Westerly Hills to begin soon, site work almost complete
