- Charlotte Fire Department #10 speaker fireman Clumpner
 1. Remember to change the batteries in your smoke detector twice a year. If you cannot afford one, the fire prevention department can assist you.
 2. If you use your fireplace, have it cleaned annually. Build up of creosote is a leading cause of flue fires.
 3. Keep a fire extinguisher in your home.
 4. Never smoke in bed or lying down.
 5. Install a carbon monoxide detector in your home.
 6. The fire department will do a fire safety analysis of your home free of charge.
