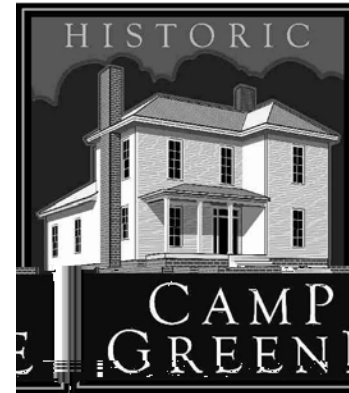

## Highlights from last months speaker, Martha Fowler, from Goodwill Industries

The goal of Goodwill is to help people find jobs and independence. You can help them by volunteering or donating goods or services. Last year alone, Goodwill helped 1,900 heads of households. At their headquarters on Freedom Drive, Goodwill employs 100 people and offer many services to the community. Among the services offered are:

1. Retail operation centers and the new computer store
2. Good works staffing offering temporary job placement.

4. Job connection working the Employment Security Commission to help with job hunting.

### Community Updates

- Irwin Creek Greenway Project is to begin by this fall. This new section of the greenway will be from Freedom Drive running along the creek behind Lela Court to Fourth Street
- Rezoning of townhouse project “Wesley Village” at the corner of Freedom Drive and Thrift.
- New shopping center “Shops at Westerly Hills Station”
- New sidewalks and curbing still underway along Freedom Drive
- Morehead curbing and sidewalks being installed now to make the area more pedestrian friendly
- Public Safety Report from Officer Scott Anderson –
  1. Reported theft is on the Increase due to appliance theft in the homes under construction in Lela Court
  2. Overall crime in the area is down significantly, including a 14.7% drop in armed robbery
  3. Code enforcement in neighborhood marking cars to have towed
  4. Currently 74 vacant homes and commercial properties in the neighborhood. Keep your eyes out for vandals and vagrants breaking into homes and businesses.

Although overall crime is down, the police ask for your help in reporting any suspicious activity. Do not hesitate to call 911.
