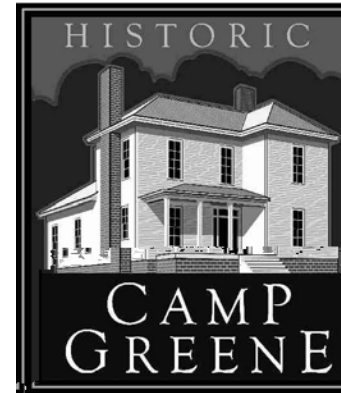

**Highlights from last months speaker:  
Matt Gustis, City Project Manager, for  
our Neighborhood Improvement Project**

By now you are aware that the city of Charlotte is spending \$4,400,000 on capital improvements to our community. Improvements include new water lines, curbs and sidewalks, and storm water drains. This project will last for at least one year. Please be patient with the construction crews as they complete their work. The most challenging and time consuming part of the process will be drainage work in the Columbus Circle area. This section will take months to complete and will require street closings and detours.

The goal of the project is not only to beautify our community and make it more pedestrian friendly, but to improve the quality and level of our city services.

### Community Updates

- Irwin Creek Greenway Project is to begin by this fall. This new section of the greenway will be from Freedom Drive running along the creek behind Lela Court to Fourth Street
- New shopping center “Shops at Westerly Hills Station” to have 22,000 square feet of retail space, Leasing by GVA Lat Purser & Associates 704-519-4200
- Starbucks Coffee is open. This Starbucks is owned by the Magic Johnson Foundation. They only open stores in economically challenged areas. Their hope is that they become a catalyst for positive change in the community.
- New sidewalks and curbing still underway along Freedom Drive
- Morehead curbing and sidewalks being installed now to make the area more pedestrian friendly
- Public Safety Report from Officer Norma Penix –
  1. Commercial break-ins along Wilkinson corridor are down
  2. Overall crime is down
  3. Prostitution sting catches a few prostitutes. Number of prostitutes in the area is still very low. Call 911 every time you see prostitutes in the neighborhood.
