Martha Threatt with the nationally funded program Project Safe Neighborhood spoke to the community about what you can do as an individual to help keep our community safe. What you can do is to:

Report anyone you suspect is in possession of an illegal firearm

Report anyone you suspect has a gun but is not allowed to have one by law

Support local police and prosecutors

Store weapons in your home securely, separating ammunition from weapons. Keep weapons secure against theft. More than 300,000 guns are stolen in home burglaries annually.
