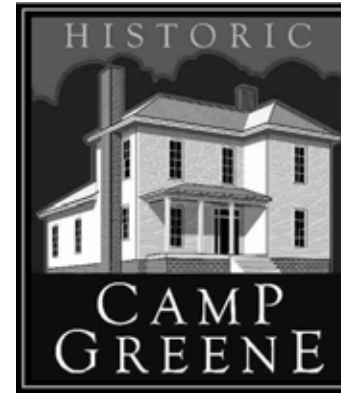

Highlights from last months meeting: Latham Grimes “Bryant Park” Project

Latham Grimes, developer of the Bryant Park Project, gave new details about the proposed development. Highlights include:

1. Expect removal of debris from Westwood Apartments to be completed by end of April.
2. Grading to begin in July and new street construction in October.
3. Currently expects to develop approximately 110 townhouses, 140 single family homes, and 250 apartment units.
4. Look for houses or townhouses to begin construction in February 2008.

Community Updates

- Police Safety report from Officer Morales: 1. Prostitution sting caught a few new prostitutes. Remember to call police whenever you see prostitutes in the community. 2. Working on closing the Toll House by building a nuisance case against the motel.
- Park and Recreation Department has leased the old #10 fire station to Brookstone School for a period of five years. After that, the fate of the station is undecided. Park and Rec has the option of purchasing Brookstones current building should they decide to move. This strategic move will help them gain control over all the land surrounding the Dowd House.
- New shopping center “Shops at Westerly Hills Station” to have 22,000 square feet of retail space, Leasing by GVA Lat Purser & Associates 704-519-4200. The slabs are poured and steel is up. Clothing Store, Sporting Goods Store, and an Asian styled restaurant will be moving in. Should be open in late June. Bank of America is installing an ATM in parking lot of Shopping Center near Hyatt Guns
