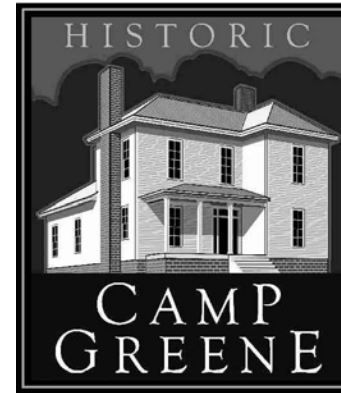

CharMeck Court Watch

Markus Philmon addressed the group regarding his organization and their goal of holding the court system accountable for sentencing repeat criminals.

In Mecklenburg County 97% of all cases are plea agreements. The DA's office prosecutes far too few criminals. The repeat offenders are on the streets committing more crimes. As a participant of Court Watch you sit in on court sessions in which certain offenders are to appear. Your goal is to be seen by the court system so they now that the public is watching. You then report back to the group in meeting which are every two weeks. To be active doesn't require a lot of time but it does require your commitment to the group.
