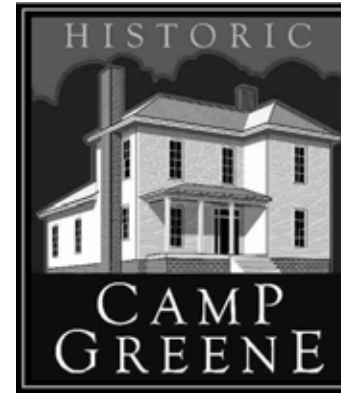

7 People Arrested at Toll House Motel

On June 1, 2007 CMPD officers executed warrants and arrested 7 people on a variety of charges and recovered stolen merchandise and firearms.

John Crider, owner of the Toll House Motel, was arrested on charges of possession of stolen property. Six others were arrested on charges including possession of drug paraphernalia. Additional charges may result as the investigation continues.

One of the buildings used by the motel was deemed unsafe by and was ordered closed.

The motel has been the target of ongoing investigations into complaints regarding criminal activity and nuisance issues.

- ❖ Police Safety report from Officer Faulkner and Captain Gallant: 31 arrested in prostitution sting, 4 in Camp Greene area. Suspect arrested in homicide on Columbus Circle. Police are stepping up patrol of known 'hot spots' in the community where criminal activity is concentrated. Overall crime is down 20% in our area.
- ❖ New shopping center "Shops at Westerly Hills Station" to have 22,000 square feet of retail space, Leasing by GVA Lat Purser & Associates 704-519-4200. The shell space is almost complete. Look for new stores including a clothing store, sporting goods store, and an Asian styled restaurant. Look for new stores this August.
- ❖ "National Night Out" is August 7, 2007 – the community plans on a cook-out to celebrate on Saturday, August 4th at the Dowd House. Plans to be finalized.
- ❖ Fall Festival & Car Show tentatively planned for September 29, 2007. Looking for ideas and a 'captain' to head-up the event.
