Community Updates

- ❖ Construction of the Charlotte School of Law is on schedule. The school will open this fall.
- ❖ P&Y Solutions zoning petition was denied by City Council. This denial will prohibit P&Y from selling used cars.
- ❖ Bryant Park neighborhood is delayed due to financing. The developer remains committed to the project and will begin construction as soon as funding is available. The apartment portion is still scheduled to start this year.
- ❖ CATS will be June's speaker. They are seeking community feedback about line changes and improvements.
- ❖ Construction is underway for Charlotte Metro Credit Union in the Wal-Mart parking lot.
- ❖ Police Safety report for May 2008 –
 - Prostitution sting within our neighborhood netted 0 arrests! Great news for Camp Greene.
 - Two search warrants were issued on houses on Marlowe. Both resulted in arrests.
 - Bishop Spaugh Middle School is seeing increased behavior problems. During the school year report any kids on the streets during school hours to police.
