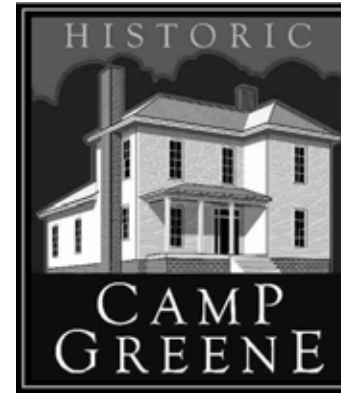

Toll House Motel Sold

The Toll House Motel was recently sold. The new owners, Two-Way Radio of the Carolinas, have been leasing space in the property next to the motel. They purchased the motel property as well as other property along West Morehead which was owned by John Crider.

The new owners have closed the motel down and will have the motel property demolished. The brick home on the property will be moved and the remaining buildings razed.

Immediate plans for the property are unclear, but Two-Way Radio of the Carolinas plans to redevelop the property to take advantage of this up and coming transit corridor.

Their goal is to get the slumlords to repair or demolish the substandard housing and to get tenants that are an asset to the community.
- ❖ New shopping center “Shops at Westerly Hills Station” to have 22,000 square feet of retail space, Leasing by GVA Lat Purser & Associates 704-519-4200. The shell space is almost complete. Look for new stores including a clothing store, sporting goods store, and an Asian styled restaurant. Look for new stores this August.
