CATS “Sprinter” Bus Line

Jason Lawrence with CATS explained to the community where CATS is in the process of establishing the express bus service from the transit center to the airport.

CATS is in the process of finalizing the locations and getting the property rights to place the new stops. The stops are a unique design and are exclusive to this line. They will feature covered glass shelters which have lighting, attached seating, trash receptacle, and artwork within the back glass panel. Each stop will have its name etched in the side panel.

The buses are hybrid and are unique to the CATS system. They will feature space for luggage storage for those commuting to the airport. The frequency of the bus is far superior to the old #5 route and will have fewer stops. The bus service will be running by this fall.
