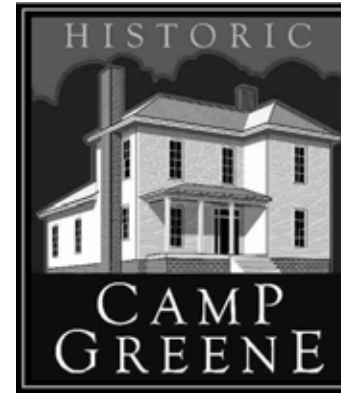

### Highlights from last months meeting: Latham Grimes' Open House Forum about the "Bryant Park" Project

Latham Grimes, developer of the Bryant Park Project, gave new details about the proposed development. Highlights include:

1. Grading to begin in July and new street construction in October.
2. Currently expects to develop approximately 110 townhouses, 140 single family homes, and 250 apartment units.
3. Look for houses or townhouses to begin construction in February 2008.
